Dear Parents & Carers,

We have almost finished another busy term at Wagaman. A small group of Year 5/6 students were lucky enough to have the opportunity to participate in a Maths challenge day recently. The day was attended by students from school who are part of the Meaningful Maths network. They worked collaboratively through a variety of challenging problem solving tasks.

On Monday at Muster I talked with students about the importance of being safe when near our roads. We have a number of students riding their bikes and scooters to school at the moment which is wonderful. It is important that they ensure they are wearing helmets and crossing the roads safely. This means walking bikes across the crossings near the school. Wagaman Terrace particularly gets quite busy in the mornings and it can be difficult for cars to see students on bikes and scooters coming out from between parked cars. If your child does ride please ensure you have a conversation with them about the importance of road safety.

School Council met on Monday evening. They usually meet on the second Monday of each month in the staffroom from 5:30pm for a 5:45pm start. All parents and carers are welcome to attend the meetings. Our next meeting is scheduled for Monday 12th October. A huge thank you to those parents who are on our council for the time they give to support our school. Being a school council member is a wonderful way to have input into the operation of our school. Last Monday, the items school council discussed included school finances, Camp Australia, plans for an Area 1 upgrade and fundraising. In the new year, we will be looking for more members. In Term 4, we are hoping to be able to return to normal school assemblies, musters and again welcome small numbers of volunteers into our school to support important class programs. 






Transition Carroll


