Dear Parents & Carers,

Welcome back to our final term for 2020. It has been wonderful to connect with all our students each morning now that we have resumed our daily morning muster. In the holidays we had quite a lot of flooding through our Early Years building. To help improve drainage around the school we have commenced the installation of a new drain at the end of our Early Years building. Work on this commenced today and we are hoping that it will be completed by early next week.

Our school netball teams competed last night in the first round of the school's competition. They demonstrated "The Wagaman Way" and we were extremely proud of their efforts. This year Wagaman have 3 teams playing. It has been wonderful to see all the student interest. A huge thank you to our staff Ms McLean, Ms Brown, Ms Chadbourne and Ms Angie for their work with our teams to make this valuable learning experience available to our Wagaman students. We wish to thank Jayde Stitfold, Sarah Armstrong, Jacintha Jensen for volunteering their time to umpire for us. It is wonderful to see these past students helping us out.

We had a number of our Year 3/4 students attend the first after school squash session on Tuesday afternoon. Everyone thoroughly enjoyed the sessions and are looking forward to attending again next week. The program will run for five weeks.

It has been pleasing to see our attendance sit above 90% over the past two weeks. At Wagaman we like to see every student every day. In the event that students are sick or there are specific family circumstances preventing attendance at school it is very important that the school is notified. This enables us to record the absence accurately in our school attendance records. The Australian Institute for Teaching and School Leadership's most recent report reinforces the strong correlation between school attendance and student achievement. It also highlights the importance of forming good attendance habits early.

We have had a few parents inquire about bringing birthday cakes in to share with classes. As part of our COVID plan we are still not participating in the sharing of food within classes. To ensure we have consistency across classes in this area, we ask that children do not bring birthday cakes or shared food in to celebrate birthdays. We will review our plan at the end of the term with regards to class Christmas parties. Our decisions in this area will be based on COVID recommendations.

Recently we have had a number of students bring chocolates and lollies to school. These types of foods are treat foods and we ask that children do not bring them to school. I have spoken to all students about this at muster.

Next Monday all classes will view a free online performance called NED's Mindset Mission. We are excited to be able to offer this wonderful performance and its important messages to Wagaman students.

What is it made from and why?


Students sorted a range of materials and classified them under headings chosen by their group. Lots of interesting discussion took place as students didn't always know the words they needed. This activity helped students tune into the question, 'What is it made from and why?' and begin to sort out what they already know and what they need to find out.



Students then identified different gloves and explored the materials used to make them and the properties of the materials used.







We are developing a word wall of the scientific words students will need as they continue to investigate properties of materials and as they work toward answering the big question, "What is it made from and why?

30 Minutes	20.7 Days


Frequent lateness can add up to a considerable amount of learning lost, and can seriously disadvantage your child.





5/6C Blackout Poetry


Students were challenged to select vocabulary from a single page of text that when put together created a unique style of poetry!








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
