One of the main focus areas for school improvement in 2021 is to build connected literacy. Previously our staff have worked with Victorian-based consultant Lisa Keskinen to develop our whole school writing program, and in 2021 we will work with Lisa to connect our reading program to our current writing program. It is a large body of work led by our school literacy team. On the 29<sup>th</sup> January, staff began this work with Lisa. On Monday the 22<sup>nd</sup> March, we will be utilising one of our whole school professional learning days to work with her. This work is vital to our ongoing focus on improving student outcomes at Wagaman. It means that students will not be able to attend school on Monday the 22<sup>nd</sup> of March. Camp Australia is available and open for the day. If you do require care for your children, please make a booking through them.

At afternoon pick up time our car park area does become quite busy for a short time. 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### **Duty of Care**

**Staff are on duty at Wagaman School from** <u>7:55 am</u> **each day.** Children are supervised in the playground from this time until our first bell goes at 8:10 am.

Please consider this prior to leaving your child at school at the beginning of the day for safety.

The few staff who are on-site early do so to prepare for their day's program. They are not deployed for supervision at this time. A further safety/care issue is having visitors on site.

<u>NO</u> children should be dropped at school before 7:55 am.

If you need to leave your child at the gate before this, it is advisable to contact the Principal to discuss.

### Late arrivals and early departures

**Early Departure:** If parents and carers need to collect their child before the end of the school day, they must report to the front office PRIOR to collect their child. Office staff will record the early departure and families will take an **EARLY** Pass to give to the teacher when collecting from the classroom.

Late Arrivals: Students are required to report to the front office when arriving after the morning bell. They will be given a LATE pass to give to their teacher, and arrival time will be recorded in the diary.

### **Uniform Policy**

**Basic uniform:** Green shirt and royal blue bottoms (shorts/skorts/skirt). **No denim or prints** 

**Sports uniform** (Wednesdays) Red or Blue shirt (House colours) and royal blue bottoms

Senior shirt (year 6): Blue & green senior shirt

Shoes: enclosed shoes

Hats: Bucket (6cm brim), broad brim or legionnaire

### Note: Baseball or peaked caps do not meet Sunsafe policy and are not permitted to be worn

If there is a reason your child cannot wear one of the uniform items, please see the Principal to discuss.

Schools in the NT have a mandatory uniform policy. This is seen as both cost effective and equitable practice. Children gain a positive sense of belonging in readily identifying with their school community.

#### **Lunch Boxes**

To ensure that food stays fresh, we provide a fridge in each class to keep your child's lunch.

Please note that food is best kept in plastic lunch containers. Insulated (esky) type containers prevent the refrigerated air from getting to the food.

If your child brings lunch to school in an esky type container, it is best to leave it in the air-conditioned classroom OR with an ice brick or frozen popper



#### Do not place insulated lunch bags in the fridge

#### **Reminders**

Please ensure your child has a water bottle and hat **EVERY** day. We ask that children in Early childhood have a spare set of clothes in their bag each day in case they are required.

Please contact the front office if your contact details have changed.



#### **Library News**

Students in Early Childhood and Middle primary MUST have a library bag for borrowing. You might buy a bag or it could be as simple as a shopping bag with their name on it.

If your child has any overdue books from 2020 or you cannot find the book please contact the school to find out how much is owing.






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### Year 3/4 Vavlas – The Learning Pit


















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### Back to school vouchers

You are entitled to receive \$150 of educational goods and services for each child enrolled in a government or non-government NT school or preschool.

If your child is in transition to year 12, you will receive the entitlement in term 1 each year. The entitlement must be used by the end of term 1.

If your child is in preschool, the entitlement is available throughout the year, but is only valid to the end of the first term in which they first enrol.
