


We are also looking for donations of soft drink cans and bottled water to sell. Please give all donations to the front office.






#### Year 1/2 Vinu

### Top End Oral Health Service

All children in the Northern Territory, aged 0-18 years, with a current Medicare card and still at school, are eligible for free dental services through Top End Oral Health Service.

Your children can visit any of our 12 school-based dental clinics in the Darwin region from age 0 until they finish primary school (year six).

Once your child starts year seven they must be seen at one of the community dental clinics (Darwin, Palmerston).
