Dear Families

It is hard to believe that we are at the end of Term 3 already. Tomorrow is our final day for the term. We look forward to seeing everyone back at school on Monday 11th October. This week we sent home our voluntary contributions reminder letter. A huge thank you to those families who have paid their voluntary contributions. This funding enables us to purchase important resources to enhance opportunities for our students.

Our classes have been busy over the last two weeks developing their cultural understandings. They have been developing their understandings about what culture is and learning about the diversity of cultures in our school. Each class is also making a product to sell based on their learning. We will hold a **Wagaman World Market on Thursday 21st October 3 – 5 pm**. Each class will sell their product and have a display of their learning to share with you. We are also hoping to have some performances from some of our community cultural groups. Please mark the date in your calendar. Our school council will also be selling drinks for their fundraising efforts at the market. They would appreciate **donations** of **bottled water** or **juice boxes** to sell. If you can help out on the drink stall please just let our administration team know. All donations can be dropped into the front office.

The use of our drop-off zone has continued to improve. Just a reminder that the drop-off zone is a **no-parking area** both in the **morning and afternoon.** We do still have some parents illegally parking in the drop-off zone in the mornings. Please be considerate of other families and refrain from parking in this area. I have had some complaints from parents regarding parking in the **staff car park area**. It is important that parents are careful and ensure they **park within the marked line.** I have received photos of cars parked across the lines, which means that it is difficult for others to get in and out of their vehicles. Our peak parking times are busy but if everyone follows the rules, are mindful of how and where they park and utilise patience, the area is safer for our students and less frustrating for families.

Over the last fortnight, we have had several excursions for our students. Some of our Transition students travelled to the tennis centre to deliver Acknowledgement of Country at a teacher professional learning day. We had a group of students participate in Pink Power AFL day. Our Wagaman Warriors played their final game last Thursday, and our Year 3/4 students have participated in after school tennis sessions. There will be two more of these sessions next term. Today, a small group of Year 3/4 students participated in a Maths enrichment morning with several students from across Darwin schools. Ms Chadbourne facilitated one of a large number of activities, and students learnt a great deal. We also have a group of students participating in the volleyball gala day tomorrow.

This week I have had to speak with some of our Year 5/6 students regarding their use of social media. One of the things I talked to students specifically about was that it is inappropriate to use our school name and branding on social media. Families need to be aware that students under the age of 13 should not have accounts on most social media platforms. If you are aware that your child has these accounts, it is essential to monitor their use. Please see the image below for the age guide regarding social media platforms.





2021 NAPLAN results have been released, and our Year 5 students achieved significant gains compared to 2019. These students also achieved greater than expected growth from their Year 3 results. All NAPLAN testing was carried out online. Our Year 3 reading results improved from 2019. Individual student reports are being prepared and checked and will be distributed to families in early Term 4.

Today the Preschool held their bikeathon. It was a beautiful morning and the students loved riding their bikes. The Blue Group held their bikeathon on Tuesday. Ms Brown's transition class even went and tallied the laps students did. This was part of their learning in Mathematics.



School uniform is compulsory in NT Government Schools. At Wagaman, our uniform consists of our green and blue shirt and royal blue shorts. We also have sports shirts that can be worn on Wednesdays. This is outlined very clearly in our parent handbook. Recently, there have been some students wearing black shorts. These are not part of our uniform. All components of the uniform are available for sale from our front office. Royal blue shorts are often also available from places like Big W or Best and Less.

Teachers from the NT Music school visited Wagaman today to provide our Year 3 – 6 students with instrument demonstrations. Teachers explained the instruments available to learn and played them for the students. Students in Yr 4-6 next year will be able to access instrument tuition at school. Those moving on to public middle schools will also be able to access lessons at their school. Next term, we welcome Ms Teneale Ah Mat back at Wagaman. Teneale will take Year 5/6 Harnett for Term 4. Ms Harnett will be beginning her parenting leave in week 4 next term. Ms Harnett and Ms Ah Mat have met this week to hand over information and plan for next term. They will both be teaching in Year 5/6 for the first week of next term to help ensure a smooth transition for the students.

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







