
Yesterday I sent a communication out to families to let everyone know that a Camp Australia before school care service will be opening at Wagaman on Monday 30th May. Bookings need to be made directly with Camp Australia. Before school care services begin at 6:30 am each morning. Supervision at school starts at 7:55 am, and from Monday 30th May, we ask families to ensure that students are not at school until supervision time begins.

It has been great to see an increase in students riding bikes to school recently. Current NT legislation states children under the age of 17 must wear an approved cycling helmet that meets Australian Standards (AS2063). The correct use of helmets significantly decreases the risk of head injuries in bike accidents. All students must wear a helmet when riding their bikes to and from school.

A big congratulations to Roy Vo, who was recently selected for the Darwin region tennis team. The team will be competing against other Northern Territory tennis teams in August.

A reminder to all families that our staff have a whole school professional learning day on Tuesday 14th June. Students will not be able to attend school that day. Camp Australia is open for bookings.

Rocketeers Late Booking Fee

Late booking fee applies if a booking is made with less than 7 day's notice. Bookings made at least 7 days in advance of the session day are charged the early fee.

Sick child? No charge

No matter the cancellation rules, we operate a standing policy that there is no charge for a sick child. Simply let us know when cancelling a booking outside the cancellation window, provide a doctor's certificate and there will be no fee charged.

Child Care Subsidy* (CCS)

The Child Care Subsidy can provide up to 85% off your fees. Your eligibility is determined by your family's annual adjusted taxable income, the type of childcare you use, and your activity level.



LEARNING SPOTLIGHT


PRESCHOOL

Most food that comes unpackaged is healthy including fruits, vegetables, fresh meat, nuts and seeds.


Packaged food can be healthy or unhealthy. Understanding how to read nutrition information can help you make healthy choices.
