This means that from the 30th of January, students will need to be registered with Child Australia for Wagaman OSHC services. Child Australia is a leading childcare organisation, providing significant industry training and running several Outside School Hours Care services in both WA and the NT. There is further information included in this newsletter, and Michelle Dolby (Child Australia Manager Practice Improvement NT) will be at our assembly tomorrow morning (8:30-9:00 am) and our annual presentation assembly on Tuesday, 13th December (8:30-10 am). We are excited to start our partnership with Child Australia and look forward to working with them. Camp Australia will run vacation care for Wagaman students during Christmas and New Year. The program will run at Wagaman from 16th – 23rd December, and then families can book in at Moil (or an alternate site if they choose) for the January vacation care. This will allow time for Camp Australia to move out of the OSHC room at Wagaman and for Child Australia to move in. Child Australia will provide OSHC services from Monday, 30th January (our pupil free day) at Wagaman.

This year we had two netball teams participate in the Term 4 competition. The teams participated well, and all had a great time. They played against a variety of other Darwin schools. It was a privilege to go down and watch the final games of the season last night. A huge thank you to Ms Elley, Ms Vicki, Ms Rachel and Mrs Chadbourne, who coached the teams. This required significant dedication and time. These opportunities are available to our students due to the incredible commitment of our teachers.






We Love Poetry!


We have written and shared many different kinds of poems and learned how to perform poetry for an audience.



EVERYONE CAN PLAY!

The Northern Territory Music School invites you to apply for your child's enrolment in our instrumental and choir programs for 2023.

Who are we?

The NT Music School is a division of the NT Department of Education that offers instrumental, ensemble and choir tuition in government schools.

What are the benefits?

Learning to play a musical instrument and singing in a choir can have both academic and social benefits, as well as being rewarding and enjoyable. We invite your child to begin their musical journey with us.

How does it work?

Application to enrol is offered to students from Year 4 in primary school and to students in middle school. Students come out of class once a week for a 30 minute instrumental lesson with an NT Music School teacher. Students play and practise at home to learn instrument technique, music reading and performance skills. Our choir program is offered by audition. Successful students attend weekly choir rehearsals after school.

What does the program offer?

Students can join a guitar ensemble or join our flute, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, trombone, and percussion lessons. They will also have the opportunity to participate in school performances and access events such as the BEAT Festival!

What will it cost?

Lessons are free. Once enrolment is confirmed, an annual contribution of \$50 is requested. Instruments can be hired for a semester from \$100. Sports Vouchers are accepted to assist with the cost of hiring instruments. Students are required to purchase a tutor book from \$25.

How can I apply?

NORTHERN TERRITORY AUSTRALIAN ARMY CADETS ENROLMENT 2023


Army Cadets is for young adults!

IDEAS IN NUTRITION

Food Safety



Good food safety skills can help protect your family from becoming sick.

Keep food safe by storing it correctly, cleaning utensils, and handwashing.

In general, how long can you keep food for?

Food	Throw away after
Raw meat in the freezer	2-4 months
Cooked foods in the fridge	2-3 days
Milk in the fridge	5-7 days
Raw meat in the fridge	3-4 days
Vegetables in the fridge	3-4 days

If in doubt, throw it out.
