



Whatever the reason we aim to provide a quality service that meets families' needs.

What is Kids Space?

Parents' separation and divorce can be a time of change and transition for everyone. It may lead to some children feeling a range of difficult emotions and a sense of unsettledness. Kids Space is a therapeutic group for children whose parents are separated and/or divorced. It is a safe space for children to be able to meet with others, share their emotions, thoughts and experiences and learn new ways to deal with issues relating to parents' separation/divorce.

How does Kids Space work?

Children share an afternoon tea and then participate in a range of activities including playing games, creating art, reading stories, and puppet play with the aim of processing family changes and grief and gaining self-regulation and coping strategies that will benefit them while at home, school and socially.

Pack a Healthier Lunch Box

Use the 5 Food Groups

Try adding one thing from each food group to each lunch box. That means 1 fruit, 1 vegetable, 1 dairy, 1 carb (like bread or rice) and 1 protein- in every lunch box.

Make Ahead

If packing lunch boxes in the morning works for you that is great! Some families find it is easier to make lunch boxes the night before or even in a batch on the weekend. Find a time that works for you.

Pack Water

Water is the best drink for children. If your child likes very cold water you could try freezing a bottle the night before.
