






We have started our Fun Read!

When students have read 10 books, hand your bookmark into the office to receive a ticket into our special weekly prize draws.




Students will also receive a new reading log to record other books read. For every 10 books read, they will receive a ticket into the prize draws.

# LEARNING SPOTLIGHT TRANSITION FULTON

On Tuesday, Transition Fulton made gingerbread men.

We have been learning about doubles in Maths and we wanted enough gingerbread men for everyone in the class so we doubled the recipe.

After doubling the recipe we needed:

- 6 cups of flour
- 8 tablespoons of golden syrup
- 4 teaspoons of ground ginger
- 2 cups of sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 cup of butter

It was easy to double the recipe except for working out what double a half was!

## LEARNING SPOTLIGHT 5/6 BEVAN

Last week, upper primary students were treated to an incursion from Australian Earth Science Education, whose Education Officer, Lachlan Hallet took them through a science inquiry on the topic of Light.

The students learnt about ultraviolet light, the effectiveness of sunscreen and sun safe clothing, and the way white light is split into the colours of the spectrum.

The students had fun observing the world through defraction glasses. They found the presentation very informative and engaging.




