


Our whole school attendance is tracking at 89% for the year to date. We have 5 classes with attendance of 90% or more for the year so far.




Our Reading Phase is ending tomorrow, Friday August 25.

All about adjectives! We have been learning about adjectives in 1/2 Ah Mat and how much they can enhance your writing. We read Edward the Emu and then created our own emus. We gave our emu a name and used adjectives to describe them.







We have been learning all about the Larrakia seasons this year. We have been researching our environment during each season and learning the some Larrakia words. Dinidjanggama (dinnudge-an-garma) is the season we are currently in, which represents heavy dew.





















HAVE YOU PAID YOUR VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTION?



Making these sweet swaps can protect kids from tooth decay.



















School Student Broadband (SSBI)

Information for families



SSBI - What is it?

SUPPORT YOUR CHILD'S EDUCATION WITH INTERNET AT HOME

The Australian Government has established the School Student Broadband Initiative (SSBI) to provide free home internet for one year for up to 30 000 families unconnected families with school aged students.

This is a targeted affordability measure to boost education opportunities and narrow the digital divide. More information about SSBI can be found at www.infrastructure.gov.au/SSBI.

Is it for me?

To be eligible, a family must:

Have a child living at home

That is enrolled in an Australian school in 2023.

Not have an active NBN internet service at home

Having a mobile internet service does not affect eligibility.

Live in a premises that can access the NBN via a standard connection.

This will be checked for you. The SSBI is unavailable on NT Island Communities.

How do I nominate?

The Department of Education is a nominating organisation for SSBI. Families can nominate in many ways. Choose one that suits you below.

- 1. Ask at your child's school for a SSBI family nomination form.
- Access the SSBI family nomination form online at https://forms.office.com/r/sLSrGb74BP or scan the QR code with your phone's camera and click on the link that appears.
- Request the SSBI family nomination form from <u>digitalanddata.doe@education.nt.gov.au</u> or by calling 8972 5344.

Nomination forms need to be returned to schools or completed online as soon as possible so that vouchers can be delivered and activated **before 30 April 2024**.



You will get a letter

Via your child's school or by email. It will tell you if you are eligible for SSBI or not

If you are eligible

Choose an internet provider listed in your letter

Activate your voucher

Sign up with your preferred internet provider and give them your voucher code before 30 April 2024

The internet provider will have a step-by-step process to get you connected. You may need to provide identification.

The one-year internet connection will start from the day your service is activated. When the one year is finished, you will not be placed on a paid service without your consent.
