This means that students work in another class for the day. All class teachers have prepared work for students to do when the class needs to be split.



It has been exciting to see our School Fun Read total rising. We have raised a total of \$7307. 60% of these funds are retained by our school and the other 40% go towards prizes and administration. We look forward to using the funds to improve the security of our school. Thank you to all students and families who participated in the event. I'm sure students are looking forward to receiving their prizes.


Wagaman Primary School acknowledges the traditional custodians of the land on which we learn, the Larrakia people. We respect their Elders, past, present and emerging.
