Mr Russell and I have been spending some mornings in the car park over the past week. This area is busy during short periods at school drop off and pick up times. To ease congestion, it is important that families utilise the drop off/pick up zone appropriately. It is a place where children can independently get out of the car and walk themselves into school. The driver must remain in the vehicle. Drivers also need to move as far down in the zone as possible to enable space for other cars to come in from behind. If your child is slow to come out, simply drive around again and re-enter the drop off zone. These little actions ensure that traffic can move more easily and freely through the zone. Most importantly we ask that families DO NOT PARK IN THE DROP OFF ZONE as this makes it difficult for other families and unsafe for Wagaman Primary School students.






Just a reminder to all families that Wagaman Primary School is a smoke free zone. This zone does also include our carpark. We have had reports of people smoking in the carpark which is a concern for the health and safety of all in our school.



Wagaman Primary School acknowledges the traditional custodians of the land on which we learn, the Larrakia people. We respect their Elders, past, present and emerging. This year, Wagaman Primary School is focusing on strengthening instruction in reading through the implementation of Read Write Inc in the Early Years and Literacy blocks across the school. Read Write Inc is a structured approach to the teaching of phonics, linking reading and writing. The focus of this program is teaching students to decode words by blending sounds.



Instruction + Engagement = Growth and Achievement

We are also focusing on strengthening engagement through the Health curriculum. An important part of this will be the implementation of the Keeping Safe Child Protection Curriculum across the school. We will be sending further information to families and be holding an information session as the year progresses.



WHAT'S THE LEARNING IN



This year, as part of our health lessons, our teachers will be using the Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum (KS:CPC), an evidence-based child safety and respectful relationships curriculum.

Government of South Australia

The program teaches children and young people ways to keep themselves safe.

The curriculum is based on two main themes which are presented through topics and activities: Theme 1: We all have the right to be safe Theme 2: We can help ourselves to be safe by talking to people we trust.

The two themes are explored through four Focus Areas, which are examined in growing complexity in accordance with the age of the learners.

- 1. The right to be safe
- 2. Relationships
- 3. Recognising and reporting abuse
- 4. Protective strategies.

The learning activities are structured in a sequential nature and at an age and developmentally appropriate level covering a range of topics.


