### MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Families,

It has been another busy fortnight at Wagaman Primary School. Last week we held Learning Conferences with students and their families. It was fabulous to see 65% of our students participate in conferences with their teachers. If you haven't connected with your child's teacher yet this year, I urge you to contact them to schedule a time to meet.

Our school uses Seesaw as a means of sharing learning with families. We also use it for some communication. It is not suitable for lengthy



ongoing communication. Should you wish to discuss learning with your child's teacher, it is best to connect with them by making an appointment to meet or phoning them after school. Generally, during school hours, our classroom teachers are teaching and are therefore unable to respond quickly to Seesaw messages. After school, teachers have meetings and professional learning. They are also busy planning and preparing for the following day before going home to their own families. Teachers are not usually able to respond to Seesaw messages after 4:00 pm. To notify your child's absence from school, please contact the front office.

We had a fabulous time this morning celebrating Harmony Day. A huge thank you to those families who braved the wet weather and joined us for a delicious breakfast. It was great to see everyone. The breakfast was also the first of our 2024 fundraising events. A special thank you to Kate Worden who made a generous donation to support us in purchasing our food for the BBQ breakfast. Congratulations to Ms Chelsea's class on running a wonderful assembly. Classes also enjoyed participating in their diverse hub activities. Our preschool students also celebrated Harmony Day with activities in the preschool on Monday.



Our second school council meeting of the year was held on Monday evening. Council meetings are held on the third Monday of every month and all families are welcome to attend. This week, council decided that money raised in 2024 will go towards upgrading our laptops and technology resources. In the past, between council fundraising and voluntary contributions made by families, we have been able to upgrade security features, purchase home reading books, shade sails, play equipment, our school bus, iPads and a variety of other learning resources. Voluntary contributions are an important component of our school finances. Voluntary contributions for students Transition to Year 6 are \$60 per child and we offer a reduced contribution rate for families with more than one child. A huge thank you to those families who have paid their contributions. We have collected \$3400 so far this year. Preschool contributions are \$50 per term and cover the cost of equipment and supplies specific to the preschool program. Contributions can be made at the front office or online at any time.

Over the past week, our Year 3 and 5 students have been working through their NAPLAN (National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy) tests. Students are tested on their skills in writing, reading, numeracy, spelling, grammar and punctuation. The results of these tests will be available to schools in Term 3.








Our attendance has risen over the last two weeks and is currently sitting at 89% for the year so far.

# WHAT ARE WE LEARNING? 2/3 CHADBOURNE

We have been wondering about 'what natural cycles and systems keep our planet working?' We started our inquiry by sorting and coming up with a criteria as to what makes something 'living.' We then explored our school grounds and collected samples to make displays of cycles occurring in our own backyard. Our questioning led us to the mangrove ecosystem, so we tapped into an expert, Ranger Natasha, who was able to come and visit us and help us build our background knowledge on these local areas. We investigated the life cycle of mangroves and made connections between living organisms, how the mangroves support them and keep our planet working. We're also keeping a journal and watching life cycles occur in real time by growing beans. We have enjoyed learning about the seasons of Kakadu by reading the book 'Walking the Seasons of Kakadu' by Diane Lucas. We have been very curious and sharpened our skills in being collaborators throughout our investigating.
