






WHAT ARE WE LEARNING? 5/6 MAIROU


5/6 Mairou have been busy learning the basics of 3D printing. Students first learnt how to use the Makers Empire software to develop their design skills and create 3D models.







Once designs are finalised, they are downloaded and imported into a different program to prepare them for printing. Through a few failed attempts, students learnt that they needed to create supports during the printing process which they could remove later.





Each time a new student design is printed, we examine the model and look for ways we can improve future builds.





We're having a lot of fun creating all kinds of designs and have even started using our printer to solve problems around the classroom.


