Over the holidays we had significant work carried out in both our playground and car park area. We now have new soft fall sand under some of our playgrounds in Area 2. Families will have noticed the new line marking that occurred in the car park. Our car park is a very busy place during the morning drop off and afternoon pick up times. It is vital for the safety of our students that families take care, to use these areas safely and model safe behaviours for their children. I do ask that families ensure they are using the marked crossing zones within the car park when collecting their children and taking them to the car.





Last Monday, our staff spent the day participating in Module 2 of Safe and Supportive De-escalation of Behaviours training. This training provided educators with skills, knowledge and practices to enable them to create an inclusive environment for students. It included positive behaviour supports, incident response and risk management. This followed on from Module 1 which staff completed at the beginning of Term 2. Module 1 focused on school-wide approaches, concepts of trauma and neurodevelopment, and putting theory into practice.

Last Friday, twelve of our Year 6 students attended a Japanese "Survivor" Day at the School of Languages. This was an interactive day where students were immersed in using the Japanese language to work through challenges.





Last Friday evening, Wagaman Primary School hosted a community movie evening. It was an enjoyable community event attended by many families. The night was made possible by many generous donations. Kate Worden, MLA for Sanderson generously donated the movie and screen. The popcorn machine was donated by Kim Farrar, Darwin City Council. Green Ant Gardeners, A & D Extreme Bright Cleaning Services, Big W and M & T Garces Cleaning Services, all helped to fund the BBQ and drinks to support our school fundraising. A huge thank you to all these groups and individuals for their support of our school. A special thank you also to our school council and staff who work on the night. We raised just over \$900.



Wagaman Primary School acknowledges the traditional custodians of the land on which we learn, the Larrakia people. We respect their Elders, past, present and emerging.



Looking forward to connecting with you at school during the term.




