



WHAT ARE WE LEARNING? YEAR 2/3 CHADBOURNE

We are always busy in 2/3C. Have a look at what a typical week in 2/3C looks like!

Fitness is a great way to get us moving and ready first thing in the morning for a full day of learning. This last week we challenged ourselves to reach personal best times in completing the obstacle course and mastering the monkey bars!





Daily Reviews help us revisit and practice literacy concepts we have already learnt.



Our Chairperson leads the morning meeting where we take the roll, go over the timetable for the day, take time for reflection, give important messages and have some sharing time.



We start our maths lessons with a Hot Spot that helps us develop our knowledge in different areas of numeracy.

This past week, the focus has been on ordering fractions. We then get into our groups and spend time developing numeracy strategies with Mrs Chadbourne, practising strategies by ourselves, completing maths tasks on the iPads or working on our knowledge.

One of the ways we improve our knowledge of basic number facts is by having Ms Halle test the speed at which we can answer equations at our level. We made some artworks out of fraction pieces this week; check out some of our creations!











We have been figuring out how to program the Spheros using block code. We have worked out how to make them move, change direction, change colours, make sounds and even speak.







We all take part in Read Write Inc sessions where we are learning sounds, using Fred Talk to decode words and developing our comprehension of texts read at our level.





We designed and created mini golf courses for the Father's Day Afternoon. We had criteria that our courses had to meet and needed to ensure they were challenging enough for even the best mini golfers!










We are inquiring into 'who was here before me and how do I know'?

This inquiry requires us to be researchers and we have been honing our questioning skills, carefully crafting questions to be 'deep questions' that will give us a lot of information and moving away from asking 'shallow questions.' It has been interesting comparing places in Darwin from how they used to look to how they look now.



WHAT ARE WE LEARNING? JAPANESE



Konnichiwa, watashi wa Miki sensei desu. Hello, my name is Miki. Students call me Miki sensei. Thank you, to the parents who supported their child to register for the speaking competition, language fest 2024 (https://www.ltant.org/language-fest-2024).

I would like to introduce what students are learning in Japanese in Term Three.

- Year 3 (Y2/3) and 4 students are learning family members, animals, fruits and vegetables. They are also learning how to ask and answer like and dislikes.
- Year 5 and 6 students are extending their vocabulary to some basic verbs and particles. They are being challenged to write a letter to Japanese students introducing themselves and their family.


