

Over the past fortnight our staff have engaged in a number of professional learning opportunities in teaching both Literacy and Numeracy. Last week, staff attended keynotes by maths consultant Michael Minus and they also had the opportunity to observe him teaching in classrooms. Michael shared several engaging maths games and activities with staff. His resources are available through his website.









Last Thursday, teaching staff spent the afternoon and evening learning more about literacy interventions and differentiation. This year, we have worked with literacy consultant, Julie Scali, to support our work and learning in this area. You can learn more about Julie's work on her website.

Last night, I had the pleasure of going down and watching our netball teams play their first games in the Darwin schools' competition at the Darwin Netball Stadium. A very big thank you to Mrs Gemma Chadbourne and Ms Rahni Tiller for volunteering to coach the team and make this experience possible for our students.





It is great to see that our drop off zone is being well utilised by families and people are ensuring they move down and through the zone as they pick up their children. We do have many families who park outside the school on Wagaman Terrace. It is important that students cross the road at the two marked crossings to go to cars parked on the housing side of the street. We have seen some students trying to cross immediately in front of the school on the bend. This is very dangerous, as it is difficult for cars driving on the road to see children coming out from between the parked cars on the bend in the road. I ask that families ensure their children use the crossings.

Everything in the bake sale will be ranging **from 50c-\$2**. There will be gluten free options for the kids who need it.






For generously designing and donating shirts for our students representing the NT at the 'Makers Empire' Kids in Space Showcase.




WHAT ARE WE LEARNING?

VERYONE CAN PLAY!

The Northern Territory Music School invites you to apply for your child's enrolment in our instrumental and choir programs for 2025.

The NT Music School is a division of the NT Department of Education that offers instrumental, ensemble and choir tuition in government schools.

Learning to play a musical instrument and singing in a choir can have both academic and social benefits, as well as being rewarding and enjoyable. We invite your child to begin

How does it work?

Application to enrol is offered to students from Year 4 in primary school and to students in middle school. Students come out of class once a week for a 30 minute instrumental lesson with an NT Music School teacher. Students play and practise at home to learn instrument technique, music reading and performance skills. Our choir program is offered by audition. Successful students attend weekly choir rehearsals after school.

What does the program offer?

Students can join a guitar ensemble or join our bass guitar, flute, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, trombone, and percussion lessons. They will also have the opportunity to participate in school performances and access events such as the BEAT Festival!

Lessons are free. Once enrolment is confirmed, an annual contribution of \$100 is requested. Instruments can be hired for a semester from \$100. Sports Vouchers are accepted to assist with the cost of hiring instruments. Students are required to purchase a tutor book from \$25.






