



Wagaman Primary School acknowledges the traditional custodians of the land on which we learn, the Larrakia people. We respect their Elders, past, present and emerging.



Over the past twelve months, school council has been discussing our school voluntary contributions. These have not increased in over ten years. Contributions are vital in supporting our school to purchase a variety of resources including computers, iPads, books for our library, sports equipment and many other things. Over the years, these have also contributed to the upgrade of playground equipment and the purchase of our bus. As part of our process, we looked at the cost of voluntary contributions at a number of local schools to review our own. As a result of this discussion and research, school council voted to increase the contributions from \$60 per student to \$80 per student from the beginning of 2025. We will continue to offer a reduced rate for families with multiple children. The voluntary contribution rate for families with two students at the school will be \$150 and for families who have three or more children at Wagaman the voluntary contribution will be a total of \$200. Families are always welcome to schedule regular payments through electronic funds transfer directly to the school bank account. Our Preschool voluntary contributions will remain unchanged.



A small group of our Year 6 students will hold a cake stall on Monday, 4th Nov. These students are raising funds to donate to the "Koalas in Care" organisation. This is a great initiative being led by some passionate students.

We are looking forward to the Halloween disco being held on Friday by our SRC. The disco will be held in the Blue Room and the SRC are asking for a gold coin donation. Early years will have their disco at recess, and primary students will have theirs at lunchtime. Students can wear their costume to school. We do ask that families are mindful of sun safety and comfort when selecting costumes. It is advisable that students bring their school uniform to get changed into after the disco (particularly the early years students). Students will also be asked to ensure masks and other props are kept in their bag until the disco.

There are currently a lot of mosquitoes everywhere in Darwin. NT Health have advised that they will be around in higher numbers in October and November. Their advice is to use insect repellents. It is advised to apply this to children in the morning prior to them coming to school. At school students are generally inside. The library is open on most days to give students an indoor option.



We are currently working to formulate our 2025 Annual School Improvement Plan (ASIP). We are required to include a goal about strengthening teaching instruction and also one about attendance and engagement. This year, we have worked extensively in the literacy space with a large focus on reading. This work will continue next year. One of the initiatives we will be working on to support engagement is through the implementation of the Be You framework. To learn more about Be You, go to their website. A reminder that school uniform is compulsory at Wagaman as at all NT Government schools. Wagaman school uniform consists of our bright green shirts, sports shirts and blue shorts or skorts. Recently there have been a few students wearing black shorts to school. These are not part of our school uniform.


CONGRATULATIONS

WHAT ARE WE LEARNING? 1/2 KNELLER

Term 4, 1/2 Kneller has been exploring the various types of weather and how this can influence everyday life. We utilised the BOM Darwin radar to observe temperatures, wind conditions and different rainfall rates during our inquiry lessons.

In weeks 1 and 2, the children created weather chart wheels to inform and help them identify the weather conditions they observed outside. We also integrated digital technology to gather new information and deepen their understanding of the Darwin weather.

During weeks 3 and 4, we conducted a science experiment to explore and investigate more about the weather and the water cycle by simulating rain in a jar. Additionally, we made a Cloud Finder, which serves as a fantastic tool for identifying different types of clouds.

Next week, we will examine the records we gathered to see which cloud type appeared the most frequently. The children had a great time in this lesson and definitely learnt a lot about the world around them.

VERYONE CAN PLAY!

The Northern Territory Music School invites you to apply for your child's enrolment in our instrumental and choir programs for 2025.

The NT Music School is a division of the NT Department of Education that offers instrumental, ensemble and choir tuition in government schools.

Learning to play a musical instrument and singing in a choir can have both academic and social benefits, as well as being rewarding and enjoyable. We invite your child to begin

How does it work?

Application to enrol is offered to students from Year 4 in primary school and to students in middle school. Students come out of class once a week for a 30 minute instrumental lesson with an NT Music School teacher. Students play and practise at home to learn instrument technique, music reading and performance skills. Our choir program is offered by audition. Successful students attend weekly choir rehearsals after school.

What does the program offer?

Students can join a guitar ensemble or join our bass guitar, flute, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, trombone, and percussion lessons. They will also have the opportunity to participate in school performances and access events such as the BEAT Festival!

Lessons are free. Once enrolment is confirmed, an annual contribution of \$100 is requested. Instruments can be hired for a semester from \$100. Sports Vouchers are accepted to assist with the cost of hiring instruments. Students are required to purchase a tutor book from \$25.




