Today, our Learning Commission participated in the annual NTLC expo with the Minister for Education. This was a great opportunity to share our 2024 work and to see the work of all NTLC schools. Our Learning Commission have worked hard over the past two years to focus on building reading engagement at Wagaman. Amongst their many initiatives was the book swap set up at the front of the school.

This weekend, our Year 5/6 Kids in Space team will travel to Adelaide with Ms Vavlas and Mr Russell to attend the national Kids in Space showcase. Our students are excited about this wonderful opportunity. They have even designed their own shirts to wear. The showcase will be held at the Australian Space Discovery Centre on Sunday evening and most of the day Monday. We wish them well for their adventure and look forward to hearing their stories when they get back.





We currently have both Speech Therapy and Occupational Therapy (OT) students working with our early years students as part of their final placements. Last week, we welcomed OT students, Jess Bloom and Olivia Ran to Wagaman. The students have started running small group therapy sessions. This work has been made possible by our partnership with CDU and an Allied Health grant we received. Speech Therapy students, Lydia and Bianca, have set up a speech information board on the noticeboard in the foyer of our school. Please take a few minutes to view the board and read the valuable information.

Healthy eating habits are vital to overall health and fitness. We ask that students refrain from bringing fast food to school. In a school day, students need to be able to learn and regulate their emotions. To support them to do this, it is vital that they have a variety of healthy food. We have a dedicated 10 minutes of eating time at lunch to support students to eat prior to going and playing.





School Council will hold their final meeting of the year this coming Monday evening. The meeting is held in the meeting room, at the front of the school and begins at 5:45pm. All are welcome to attend. Council members are selected in February each year at our Annual General Meeting. I urge families to consider joining council. It is a great way to have a say in the operation of the school and connect with both staff and other families.

Looking forward to seeing everyone at our end of year celebration activities.






# WHAT ARE WE LEARNING? 5/6 MAIROU

Have you ever wondered how computers actually work?


This term, our class has been exploring the world of digital technologies. Students have been learning how digital systems work, and how computer hardware and software work together to complete tasks using instructions written in various coding languages.


At the heart of these languages is binary - from Latin binarius meaning 'consisting of two'.




Binary code is how people communicate with computers. All information sent to a computer is actually transmitted through a series of on/off electrical signals, which are represented as a series of ones and zeros.

We had fun combining creativity and technology by making binary bracelets. Students created bracelets where each bead pattern represented letters in binary code.
































# KIDS IN SPACE NATIONAL SHOWCASE 2024

A special thank you to Craig, from Hard North, for donating shirts and bringing the students design to life.



## EVERYONE CAN PLAY!

The Northern Territory Music School invites you to apply for your child's enrolment in our instrumental and choir programs for 2025.

#### Who are we?

The NT Music School is a division of the NT Department of Education that offers instrumental, ensemble and choir tuition in government schools.

#### What are the benefits?

Learning to play a musical instrument and singing in a choir can have both academic and social benefits, as well as being rewarding and enjoyable. We invite your child to begin their musical journey with us.

#### How does it work?

Application to enrol is offered to students from Year 4 in primary school and to students in middle school. Students come out of class once a week for a 30 minute instrumental lesson with an NT Music School teacher. Students play and practise at home to learn instrument technique, music reading and performance skills. Our choir program is offered by audition. Successful students attend weekly choir rehearsals after school.

#### What does the program offer?

Students can join a guitar ensemble or join our bass guitar, flute, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, trombone, and percussion lessons. They will also have the opportunity to participate in school performances and access events such as the BEAT Festival!

#### What will it cost?

Lessons are free. Once enrolment is confirmed, an annual contribution of \$100 is requested. Instruments can be hired for a semester from \$100. Sports Vouchers are accepted to assist with the cost of hiring instruments. Students are required to purchase a tutor book from \$25.

#### How can I apply?

Head to the NT Music School website <u>www.ntms.net.au</u> for more information, and complete the online Application Form for the Instrument Program or the Choir Program.

Applications close 1st December, 2024.


