



WHAT ARE WE LEARNING? YEAR 3.4 FULTON

In Week 5, 3.4 Fulton visited the Shoal Bay Waste Management Facility to participate in the first 2025 Waste & Recycling Education Session.

The session began with a presentation explaining how Darwin's waste is managed. Students then had the opportunity to sort rubbish and put it in the appropriate bin. The final activity was a visit to the Darwin Reviva Reuse Shop. Students worked in small groups to find items that would be useful in:

- the home
- at school
- for camping
- for sport

Students were extremely impressed with the low prices and value for money offered!













Students gained insights into the operation of Shoal Bay Waste Management Facility and learnt ways to minimise household waste and recycling contamination. They returned to school with ideas about how we could do better.

This excursion coupled with our earlier excursion to Casuarina Library gave students an understanding of the work of our local council – the work it does and the services it provides.








HIPPY (Home Interaction Program for Parents & Youngsters) is a FREE two-year family learning together program.
