
Wagaman Primary School acknowledges the traditional custodians of the land on which we learn, the Larrakia people. We respect their Elders, past, present and emerging.



JAPANESE

Nihongo (Japanese) Corner (Term1)



こんにちは Konnichiwa, watashi wa Miki sensei desu.

Hello, my name is Miki. Students call me Miki sensei. It has been great working in Wagaman school as a Japanese teacher since 2023. I am so excited to continue the Japanese program with students at Wagaman school this year, 2025.

Our language programs aim to build not only proficiency in language, but students with an open mind who have curiosity for different cultures and an understanding of how to communicate respectfully.

I would like to say Arigato (thank you) to the families for supporting the Japanese program. I have heard that some Wagaman students went to Japan last year or are planning to go to Japan this year. It is wonderful and the best way for language learners to immerse themselves in the culture and to build confidence and enthusiasm in learning.

I believe a great way to encourage your child to be a great language learner is for parents to show interest in learning a language. Please ask your child/ren what they have learnt at school each week and use the words at home too. We also have a "Using Japanese at home" tip sheet for parents.

I will introduce a few greeting words you can use at home.



こんにちはKonnichiwa = hello

おはよう ohayo = good morning

げんきです genki desu = Iam well, Iam fine



Are you planning a family trip to Japan?

I would like to give some tips about Japanese style hotels, 旅館 Ryokan.

You might want to experience a Japanese traditional style Ryokan at least once if you travel to Japan, for its serene atmosphere and chance for cultural immersion. In ryokan, you may have a room which has a tatami mat and a low table in the middle with cushions. You don't find a bed there, but later a lady called Nakai san will come to prepare a futon (Japanese style sleeping mattress) for each customer while out of the



room. It's a comfortable and unique way to experience Japanese tradition. Meals at a ryokan feature delicious Japanese food, often served as part of a multi-course dinner, highlighting seasonal flavours and local ingredients. Guests can also enjoy a relaxing soak in an onsen, a natural hot spring bath, or the daiyokujo, a communal bathhouse. To complete the experience, guests are provided with a yukata, a lightweight cotton robe, perfect for walking around the ryokan or enjoying the evening. Staying at a ryokan is a memorable way to experience Japan's rich culture and hospitality.

WHAT ARE WE LEARNING? 1.2 KNELLER

This term, in our Geography and Science inquiry lessons, Year 1.2 K have been exploring how places are identified and represented, and how they change over time.

Working in pairs, students investigated and compared two of our school's unique and well-loved spaces: Mayuma Garden (our vegetable garden) and Area 2 (playground). Their goal was to identify what makes each place different by classifying the features they observed as natural, managed or constructed.

Through this exploration, students quickly noticed key differences between the two areas. They observed that the vegetable garden is full of living and natural features, such as plants, soil and insects, whereas the playground contains mostly constructed features, like play equipment, rubber flooring and shade cloth. During our discussions, we also discovered that the Mayuma Garden can be classified as managed and reflected on how each space is used, how it has changed over time and the role people play in maintaining it.

This experience has encouraged students to think critically about their surroundings and deepened their understanding of how places and materials change with time. Overall, it has been a fulfilling learning journey throughout the term.


