Our Year 3 and 5 students have now completed the 2025 NAPLAN (National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy) testing. All students in Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in NAPLAN each year. It involves the implementation of 4 tests across a two-week period. The tests are reading, numeracy, writing, and conventions of language (spelling, grammar & punctuation). We are hoping to receive results next term. When reviewing results, it is important to remember that these are single tests held on single days. In a classroom across the year, your child will participate in a variety of assessments and teachers will be able to share a more in depth understanding of your child's achievement.

This term, our Year 3.4 students have visited Shoal Bay Waste Management Facility. It has been a fabulous learning experience. Some of them even shared their learning with the whole school at muster. We are fortunate at Wagaman to have a school bus which makes these local excursions more accessible for our families and students.





Our Year 5.6 choir students are working hard to get ready for The Beat, which is an annual performance involving many NT schools. The Beat Festival involves a 300-voice choir and 25-piece orchestra, as well as dance groups and vocalists. It is coordinated by the NT Music School in collaboration with local schools. Last week, Wagaman hosted a Beat cluster rehearsal, which meant that several choirs from neighbouring schools joined us for the day. Thank you, to Ms Horne who coordinates the Wagaman choir. We are looking forward to seeing the choir perform at The Beat Festival in September.

Last week, our teachers worked together in their teaching teams on their planning for Term 2 at their quarterly collaborative planning day. A key component of this was working with Literacy Impact consultant, Julie Scali. She worked with teachers to provide professional learning and to support in planning their Term 2 literacy work. This is part of our literacy school improvement focus for 2025. At the beginning of next term, many of our teachers (Preschool – Year 4) will be participating in Talk for Writing training. This is a framework for the teaching of writing that links oral language to writing. Some of our early years classes have been using the framework this year and teachers are looking forward to learning more.



Wagaman Primary School acknowledges the traditional custodians of the land on which we learn, the Larrakia people. We respect their Elders, past, present and emerging.







We have recently been fortunate to be able to partner with NT Health to provide vision screening for our students in Preschool to Year 1. This has been very worthwhile, with information being given to families about any further investigation that may be required. Regular vision and hearing tests are important in the early childhood years to support student access to learning and help them achieve their potential.

The recent wet weather has provided some much needed respite from the heat. It has caused some challenges during drop off and pick up times. It is vital that families are patient and mindful of everyone at these busy times. Parents need to either drop students off in the drop off zone or park in the carpark to drop off. It is not safe to let children get out of the car on the road just before the internal crossing or whilst stopped in the carpark area out of the designated parking zones.



As we move towards the holidays, I wish everyone a safe and happy break and look forward to seeing all students back at Wagaman on Tuesday, 15th April.




