Welcome to Wagaman Preschool. We hope you and your child enjoy your time with us and take the opportunity to become a part of our school community here at Wagaman.

Our Preschool program is governed by the Australian Children's Education & Care Quality Authority (ACECQA). Additionally the program reflects the principles, practices and outcomes of the Early Years Learning Framework (EYLF) which provides a guide for us to promote children's learning using researched best practice strategies. The EYLF view children's lives as characterised by the following:-

Belonging - knowing where and with whom you belong

Being - recognises the significance of the here and now in children's lives

Becoming - children's identities, knowledge, understandings, capacities, skills and relationships change during childhood.

Our Preschool provides a warm and secure environment for you and your child. Learning through play is integral to our program and children are encouraged to develop as individuals within our community of learners. Social skills, wellbeing, independence and oral language skills are viewed as being critical aspects of early childhood development.

We offer a flexible setting to support your child's individual developmental needs:

- We provide rich experiences so that children are given the opportunity to, explore, investigate, experiment, problem solve and discover
- We provide an engaging environment that stimulates children's imagination and curiosity
- We offer a flexible setting with open ended materials to engage children in creative play
- We provide developmentally appropriate practice where children's individual needs are catered for
- We foster risk taking and challenges to develop positive self-confidence and resilience
- We promote independence and build on children's self-esteem and individuality

We endeavour to create a happy, positive start to your child's future education and development, by providing a safe, nurturing and supportive learning environment.







We encourage parents and carers to contact us at any time, meet with us and spend time at the Preschool so that you also feel supported and secure in the Preschool environment.

Contact Information

It is essential that we have your up to date contact details and that you notify us of any changes to your address or phone contact immediately. Current information is essential in case of an emergency or illness.

Fundraising

Preschool is not a compulsory year of schooling. As a result Federal and Territory Government funding is minimal. To help supplement our program, fundraising is also an important means of income. Preschool Voluntary Parent Contributions form part of this fundraising


Preschool contributions help cover the cost of paint, paper, equipment and supplies. Contributions can be paid \$5.00 weekly or \$50.00 per term (4 terms per year). Wagaman Primary School front office has Eftpos facilities for easier payment options.

Back to School Voucher

The Northern Territory Back to School Voucher is available for all Preschool children. This helps with the cost of school uniforms, excursions, library bags and stationery.

What does my child need?

- A school bag
- A water bottle
- A piece of fruit/vegetables for morning tea
- A healthy lunch such as a sandwich and a piece of fruit
- School uniform including a wide brimmed hat
- Shoes that they can be put on and off by themselves (no thongs)
- A change of clothes including underwear

Preschool Sessions

Our Preschool offers parents a program of two full days and one half day, in keeping with the Australian Government regulations for the provision of 15 hours of Preschool per week.

Our full day program has two groups, Blue and Yellow.

Blue group session times are as follows:-

- Monday & Tuesday 8:15am-2:30pm
- Wednesday 8:15am- 10:45am

Yellow group session times are as follows:-

- Wednesday 12:00pm 2:30pm
- Thursday & Friday 8:15am-2:30pm

Feel free to nominate one of the groups when enrolling your child, keeping in mind that we will look at all enrolments on an individual basis, whilst also keeping a balance in numbers and gender ratios.

Lunches

As we promote healthy eating at Wagaman School, children are to bring a healthy morning tea and lunch to preschool on the full day sessions. We encourage children to drink water and not juices please. Lollies, chocolates and soft drinks are not accepted at Preschool and will be sent home.

On a Wednesday children will need to bring a piece of fruit or some vegetables for a healthy snack for morning/afternoon tea. Please ensure your child has breakfast/lunch on Wednesday before Preschool.

Half Day

We understand that some children are developmentally not ready for full day Preschool sessions and wish to continue to offer a flexible program. Parents may negotiate a modified program with Preschool staff, and your child may attend for half days in addition to the Wednesday session.

Over the year we will closely monitor children and may make suggestions if we feel your child is not coping with the chosen full day group. Open communication between Preschool staff and parents/carers is essential in providing the best opportunities and Preschool experience for your child.

Learning Journals

Each child will be set up with an electronic 'Learning Journal' on See Saw. This is one of the many ways that we observe and record your child's learning at Wagaman Preschool. It also provides a link between Preschool and home.

Arriving at Preschool

Parents/carers are required to sign their child in on arrival and collection. For your child's safety and in line with the National Quality Standards (NQS) it is essential parents/carers stay with children until the Preschool is open at 8:15am. You are welcome to wait in our foyer area. We encourage you to browse through our parent information stand, check our Preschool notice board, collect your child's art work or have a chat with other parents.

On arrival, please encourage your child to be as independent as possible. Children can put their own bag away, place their lunchbox in the refrigerator, drink bottle (water only) in the tray and join their peers for puzzles and books. You may also join your child for puzzles or read a book with them before our morning session begins.

Collecting your child from Preschool

Please be on time when collecting your child from Preschool. Children become quite anxious if they are not collected on time so please ensure that you make appropriate arrangements so that children are picked up promptly. After school care programs are available if you work later hours and information is available at the Wagaman Primary School Front Office.

If you are, for any reason, late picking up your child, please contact the school. It is Preschool policy that no child is allowed to leave **unless accompanied by an adult**. Written permission is required for adults other than parents or carers picking up your child.

Newsletters

Wagaman Primary School newsletters are written every fortnight and are available on the SkoolBag app. Preschool will write newsletters twice a term and these will also be available on the SkoolBag app. If you would prefer a hard copy of newsletters, please let us know so we can keep you informed.

Buddies

Each year the Preschool children connect with a senior class to implement a buddy program. We meet with our buddy class each fortnight to participate in fun activities such as reading together, ball games, sharing activities at Preschool etc. The aim of the program is to support children in their transition to school.

Health & Safety

If your child is unwell please keep him/her home so that they do not spread their germs. If they are not going to be attending Preschool please contact the school by phone or send through an email. Absences are recorded on student files if they are not notified.

Medication & Accidents

In order for medication to be administered to your child by Preschool staff it is required that parents/carers complete an authority to administer form. Medication will not be administered without written consent. If your child falls ill at Preschool or has an accident we will contact you as soon as possible.

Upon enrolment, please specify any known allergies, symptoms and signs to look out for and outline appropriate response and treatment. Likewise, if your child suffers from asthma or anaphylaxis, no matter how mild or severe, please see your family doctor before enrolling them in Preschool and have them complete an Asthma/Anaphylaxis Management Plan. Your child's medical plan will be kept on file and be used in case of an asthma/anaphylaxis attack.

Hearing & Eyesight

We highly recommend that you have your child's hearing and eyesight checked before they start Preschool. Staff at the Preschool can organise for a hearing test. Eye testing must be organised privately and most optometrists will bulk bill for this service

Infectious Disease Table (Northern Territory Centre for Disease Control)

If your child has any of the following they must stay home for the recommended recovery time.

Preschool Library

Reading to children is an important daily activity at home and Preschool. To encourage and develop a love of reading we have our own library and welcome families to borrow books at any time. Children must have a library bag in order to borrow.

Swimming

Swimming occurs Term 1 and Term 4. Each group is offered water activities and swimming in the Preschool pool one day per week for approximately 5-6 weeks. Parents will be notified through the newsletter when this will occur and will be asked to complete a permission form.





Birthdays

We are happy to celebrate children's birthdays at Preschool, however our healthy eating policy states that we are to ensure that we promote healthy food eating. We would suggest a fruit platter or healthy food as an alternative to a cake for birthdays.

Preschool Agreements

During your child's first few weeks of Preschool children will be introduced to our Preschool rules which are reflective of the TRIBES agreements. These Agreements are used by the whole of Wagaman Primary School and become our code of behaviour at all times with everyone we come into contact with. They are upheld by adults and children alike. The Wagaman Preschool agreements are:

- Mutual Respect We treat others as we would like to be treated
- Attentive Listening We listen with our eyes, ears and hearts
- Appreciations/No Put Downs We speak kindly to others and consider their feelings
- Participation/Right to Pass Everyone has different comfort levels that affect how they choose to participate
- Personal Best We try our best in everything we do
- Creativity, Kindness and persistence are the school values and are also promoted in preschool

Playgroup

All parents, carers and children are welcome to attend our Wagaman Playgroup. The playgroup sessions are intended to provide opportunities for parents and children to meet each other, become comfortable in our Preschool environment and interact through play experiences. Parents are expected to stay for the whole session and are involved in the running of Playgroup sessions. Children of all ages are welcome. Playgroup currently operates on a Friday morning from 8:30am - 10.30am.



Parent / Carer Involvement

As a parent you are your child's first teacher and an important source of information to us. We encourage you to make a time to meet with us before the end of the year to discuss your child's interests, your own hopes and expectations and other important information that can assist us to work with your child.



We have a Volunteer sign in book in the foyer for you to register when you arrive and sign out when you leave.
