LEARNING SPOTLIGHT

YEAR 1/2 GANT

This term in Inquiry, 1/2 have been finding out what makes Australian Animals different.

We have been busy identifying the features of animals and exploring the reasons behind the features. We looked deeper into the features of crocodiles and how their webbed feet help them swim. We then had to be thinkers and scientifically annotate our drawings of crocodiles. We also researched koalas and how they use their claws to climb trees in search of food.



This week, 1/2 Gant became investigators and explored the school grounds in search of local animals. On our adventure, we found butterflies, a frilled neck lizard, plovers, curlews and much more. It was amazing to see the wide range of wildlife who call Wagaman home.



We are looking forward to our visit from Crocodylus Park next week to teach us more about Australian animals.
