- Did you know Yi Peng Festival and Loy Krathong Festival are often confused with one another as they're very similiar and celebrated on the same day. However, the two festivals are actually different.

Did You Know?

The scene in the movie 'Tangled' where they release the lanterns into the sky? That comes from the Yi Peng lantern festival in Chiang Mai, Thailand. It takes place on the 12th full moon on the Thai calendar which is the time everyone has good fortune and is the perfect time to make a wish. The Lanterns are released into the air to light up the night sky, to mark the end of the monsoon season and the beginning of the cool season.
